# **Christian and the Environment 1**

Purpose: To show how theology is a practical toolbox to help us approach issues Biblically. To do this by developing a position on the environment

#### 1. <u>Introduction</u>

What should the believer do about the environment? What should the church do?

We need a Biblical view on environmental issues Does Bible have anything to say on the environment? Should we expect it to? Why?

What verses tell us that we should?

**2 Timothy 3:16** All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; <u>17 so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.</u>

WCF 1:6 The whole counsel of God concerning all things necessary for His own glory, man's salvation, faith and life, is either expressly set down in Scripture, or by good and necessary consequence may be deduced from Scripture: unto which nothing at any time is to be added, whether by new revelations of the Spirit, or traditions of men.

Are there any reasonable deductions we can add?

If the Scriptures are complete

If they tell us all we need to know for life and faith We must conclude the Bible contains all we need to know to conduct ourselves in a way pleasing to God in this matter.

How else shall we know God's will and do it in this area? If it is not in the Bible, where shall we find it?

In what way will the Bible help us?
Can we turn up a verse that talks of it?
Will there be a proof text on greenhouse gases?
No – then how do we approach this kind of issue?

Stick a pin in the Bible and seek guidance?

No - we derive principles from Scripture and apply them

This study will be a worked example of that

- 1) What is the Problem?
- 2) What principles from the Bible apply
- 3) Construct them into a Biblical framework
- 4) Do it!
